Winter clothing needed in Ukraine

Local church taking donations for humanitarian aid



Local residents are requesting donations of winter weather clothes to ship to refugee locations in western Ukraine. "The harsh winter is coming to Ukraine and hundreds of thousands will be ill-prepared," said Searcy resident John L. Kachelman Jr. "When Russia invaded Ukraine, 300,000 people had to flee their homes and possessions in eastern Ukraine. They left in the middle of summer wearing summer clothes."

He said donations can be dropped off at College Church of Christ, 712 E. Race Ave. in Searcy. A group of local volunteers will load up the donated items into a container Friday and plan for more container shipments in the coming weeks, Kachelman said.

"We need heavy coats, gloves, hats, scarves, winter boots and any type of warm clothing," he said. "Please help us collect as many winter clothes as possible! Hundreds of thousands are asking for help. Will you hear their plea and respond?"

Kachelman said he keeps in constant communication with various contacts in Ukraine, Europe and the U.S. as a private sector strategy is worked out to provide the critical assistance that is needed in the war-torn nation.

"The traumatic suffering upon Ukraine's innocents is horrific," he said.

Kachelman said the majority of Ukraine people live in "deplorable living conditions," including hospital patients having to "bring their own clothes, own medicines, their own food and they had to go home if they wanted a bath. And the orphanages were in even worse condition. The children there often only had one pair of clothes. Many had no shoes."

Along with the subpar conditions, Kachelman said the hospital's supplies also are outdated.

However, he said there is encouragement. "Our brethren are working to share the Lord's compassion," Kachelman said. "The gospel is being preached. Souls are being saved. God is blessing us with opportunities in other areas of the world."

Locals Load Buckets for Ukraine

The twenty-ninth container of 2014 to Ukraine was loaded Friday 19 September 2014. The container was filled with 21,078 pounds of benevolent supplies that included 375 Family Buckets, medical supplies, 705 boxes and bags of winter clothing and shoes and an assortment of other items that are urgently requested at this time to assist in offering relief to those who have been wounded and displaced by the war that resulted when Russia invaded Ukraine in March. Here is a report that was printed in the Searcy Citizen about the loading on Friday. This coming Monday and Friday we will load two more containers that will be shipped into Ivano-Frankivsk and Kryvy Rih (Krivy Rog), Ukraine. This will make 31 containers shipped into Ukraine thus far in 2014. The most recent reports from Ukraine state that 1.7 MILLION have been displaced by Russian aggression. We continue to receive winter wear items (clothing; boots; coats; hats; scarves; gloves, etc), Family Buckets, and medical items that are essential in treating the wounded. We are being asked for more food for the refugee locations.

AN UPDATE ON THE FUNDS RECEIVED FOR PAYING SHIPPING COSTS

We will soon be sending a full report to those who have donated money or commodities to assist those in Ukraine who have been displaced or wounded by Russia's evil aggression.

Our efforts will continue. The cruel winter months are about to begin—from mid-October until early April the temperatures in Ukraine will be harsh. Those displaced do not have the proper clothing and footgear, the housing quarters are not winterized, the heating capacities are woefully inadequate and the food resources are frighteningly scarce.

From morning briefing papers on 16 September 2014 were a number of posts and discussions among which were these two troubling accounts:

September 16 – Contrary to the agreements signed by Russia on September 12th with the EU and Ukraine, Russia still intends to punish Ukraine, destroy its economy and introduce duties on Ukrainian goods.

September 16 – Pro-Russian terrorists and Russian military haven't stopped shelling Kuibyshev and Kyiv districts of Donetsk using heavy artillery, – informed the spokesman for the National Security and Defense Council Andriy Lysenko. This is "Russian-style ceasefire". They pretend the shelling is done by the National Guards of Ukraine. Since ceasefire announcement on September 5th, the terrorists and Russian troops fired at Ukrainian military on 296 occasions.

As of 19 September 2014, we have used funds donated for shipping costs to transport these containers into locations in Ukraine where the displaced people are located and our brethren are able to validate a genuine distribution to those who are in need. Distribution is in the name of the churches of Christ!

(2 Corinthians 9:12-15 NASB).

CONTINUING PLANS

We are continuing to collect, sort and pack relief commodities that will be shipped into Ukraine. There is a great need for winter weather clothing items. We have a container in Indiana that is full of winter clothing but we need transportation costs to ship it. We plan to ship a container out of Cincinnati, Ohio of dry food mix and water purifier that will have 300,000 meals and provide 120,000 gallons of water. We are shipping peanut butter out of Columbus, MS in parcel boxes that hold 70 pounds of peanut butter and costs \$120.00 shipping. These boxes will go directly to contacts in Ukraine and will not have to clear Customs. We have 500+ Family Buckets that are ready to ship. The winter is coming. These commodities need to be shipped now as they will require 4-6 weeks for transport. If we ship now we cannot begin distribution until the first week of November when the clod has already begun. There is an immediate urgency to get these containers into Ukraine quickly!
