"PROVIDENCE IS BEST VIEWED FROM THE REARVIEW MIRROR. PROVIDENCE IS BEST ACCLAIMED IN THE PAST TENSE AS THE HYMN SINGS, 'THE LORD HAS BEEN MINDFUL OF ME'."

"Providence" has always been perhaps the most intriguing doctrine of the Bible. Although it is an absolute fact, providence remains an elusive specific. Our inability to identify providential workings with confidence was admitted by the Apostle Paul as he noted "For perhaps" (Philemon 15).

Although elusive and unspecified providence provides a great comfort to God's People as they struggle. As Habakkuk struggled with the geopolitical events and the political evils of his world that trouble godly people living in an ungodly civilization, he expressed the frustrating disconnect of his firm faith that Jehovah God is in control with the seeming invulnerability of ungodliness. The prophet's perplexity received this assurance from the Almighty God (Habakkuk 1:5)..."I am doing something in your days." The active providence of the Almighty in the world's affairs is stated by the prophet in Daniel 2:20, 21: "Daniel said, 'Let the name of God be blessed forever and ever, For wisdom and power belong to Him. 'It is He who changes the times and the epochs; He removes kings and establishes kings; He gives wisdom to wise men and knowledge to men of understanding."

And think upon the poignancy of the personal touch that providence even has within each congregation as "(N)ow hath God set the members each one of them in the body, even as it pleased him" (1 Corinthians 12:18). Have you ever considered that God's providence has placed you in the congregation to accomplish the divine will? A realization of this simple point will transform the energy and dynamics of the local congregation.

The message of inspiration is simple...you should never think that God is inactive, unaware, distant, or unconcerned!

Providence is best viewed from the rearview mirror. Providence is best acclaimed in the past tense as the hymn sings, "The Lord HAS been mindful of me." Paul and Barnabas took a backward look at the providential happenings in the mission field and "when they had arrived and gathered the church together, they *began* to report all things that God had done with them and how He had opened a door of faith to the Gentiles (Acts 14:27).

Rejoice in the absolute assurance of God's providential workings— "*I am doing something* in your days."

No one can chart the whys, hows, and absolutes of providence. We believe it and we trust it. God does "guide, guard and protect us." Even after the fact is assured, all we can say is what Paul said, "For perhaps."

At times I am awed and unable to grasp Lord's mercy that He blesses us with through your great help.

We never cease to prayerfully thank God for your hearts and care that you give us.

May God bless you and your families.

Yes, brother John McMeen wanted to know how I and my family came to know Christ's Church, so I shared briefly with him, he is very thoughtful brethren.

Your love and passion for The Lord's Church is very inspiring and motivating for me.

Subject: My family and how I came to know Jesus and His Church.

I come from a family of Ten (10): my parents and eight siblings. We were actually nine siblings but our elder brother died in 1999 through an accident on the sea.

So currently I am the male elderly son of my family. I have two elderly sisters and younger one. In all, I have three sisters and four younger brothers.

My parents have no formal education and my two elder sisters, only had up to junior high school. But my parents are my inspiration to pursue higher education especially my father has been always encouraging me because he did not had anyone to advice/support him on his education when he was growing up but as an adult he knows the importance of it. So he would do whatever humanly possible to support you once you choose to pursue education. At times they had to borrow to pay our fees. My parents are farmers.

Currently my younger sister is pursuing education in teacher training college on a distance program whiles my other four brothers, two had completed senior and junior high school respectively, the last born is in junior high. My brother after me could not complete his senior high and is currently at home due to his bad choice.

I am married to Mrs. Emma Nimoh with two kids (Emmanuel Jnr and Emmanuelle). Prior to coming to Ukraine to study Medicine, I had diploma in General Nursing and Nurse Anesthesia respectively. In all, I have work for seven years as a government employee.

My wife is ENT nurse and employee of government as well. We live in government bungalow in Koforidua (Eastern Regional capital of Ghana) with my two siblings (Diana and Paul). The rest of my family is in countryside of Kumasi, Ghana.

Upon operating the organization for almost a decade ago, I fully came to appreciate the essence of my existence and why I was called to Christ and His Church.

I came to know Christ and His Church through a one week missionary preaching program in my village organized by Offinso-New Town Church of Christ with its USA partners in 1997.

Upon reading the various materials they gave me and intermittent fellowship with them, in 2003 January 26th, I was finally baptized in Old Estate Church of Christ, Koforidua, Ghana.

Since then I have been a brethren and my absolute desire is to serve the Lord and humanity to the best of my capability. Is with this burning desire cause me to embark on medical education in Ukraine to enable me to obtain legal license to practice in my country to continue the work of the organization to offer health care to clients whom we get during our outreach programs as I received over a decade ago.

It was the most difficult and painful decision to leave my wife and kids behind but with mutual understanding and her full support, and the grace of God, I was able to set off from the shores of Ghana to Donetsk National Medical University, Eastern Ukraine in 2013 to study medicine starting from the third year of courses because they would accept four years based on my previous studies.

But due to the crisis in eastern Ukraine, we were moved to western Ukraine (Ivano-Frankivsk National Medical University) to continue my studies but the university authorities refused my transcript from Ghana and accepted me only into first year. I almost went back to Ghana because I never planned for it to take so many years.

My journey has been challenging but the grace of God has been so sufficient for me.

Since my childhood, you are the first person to ask me to know about my family and how I came to know Christ, honestly I am really touched and glad.

It has been a sober reflective exercise for me and help me to fully appreciate how much The Lord has done for me and my family.

Once again, Thank you very much Brethren (brother John McMeen) and may The Lord continue to bless you and your entire generation.

This is a short summary about me and please do not hesitate to make any further injury, I will be gladly to respond.

IVAN SKOLEBA REPORTS FROM IVANO-FRANKIVSK!

Greetings, dear brothers and sisters!

The month of October was very good and abundant in various events for us.

First of all, we rejoiced in good fellowship with other brothers and sisters from America (who visited from Arkansas, Tennessee, and Ohio). Thank you for the time we spent together in the mountains studying the Bible. Many brethren here could not possibly afford it without your financial support.

Bible classes were very good, on topics that are urgently needed for us and the entire congregation. We were astonished to see so many people come to Bible classes. Those were friends and relatives of our members. We expected 50 but the final total attending was 94 (and some counted over 100 with children)!

Such a large number attending complicated our work in terms of additional arrangements, such as rent of one more hotel and two shifts for meals. But despite all of these, everybody was pleased and happy because such fellowship strengthens our faith and encourages us.

Thank you, brothers and sisters, for good lessons and your talent of being orderly. This congregation would grow much faster both spiritually and in numbers if we could have such joint retreats with Bible classes at least once a year.

For some it was the first exposure to such an event and they told us, "We never expected American Christians to be so kind and so loving to people that they would come here sacrificing their time and money."

Due to our poor economy many people have to restrict themselves in terms of food let alone going somewhere for such a retreat, which they simply cannot afford. It was nice to see that everybody appreciated your sacrifice and did not take it for granted. Women were especially thankful for classes and time spent together. Teens were happy to have that fellowship as well. We are very thankful to brothers Gary and Ron for their work to set up this trip. We are also thankful to them for helping our medical workers and thanks to that help many doctors are willing to help Christians with a priority. All medical institutions of the Ivano-Frankivsk Region think highly of the church of Christ thanks to humanitarian aid that we have been providing for many years.

John Kachelman taught great classes on Modern Spiritual Idolatry (titled "Making God in OUR Image"). Thanks to those classes many Christians reconceptualized their attitudes because previously they did not understand those truths that brother John revealed to us through his lessons. Thanks also to brother John Durham for his classes on Philippians which contributed much to spiritual buildup of our congregation.

We are enjoying some good opportunities to spread the Gospel in Ukraine nowadays. Many people lost everything to the war and are discouraged by the government and have no hope because they did not trust in God. Andrew, who was at the retreat for the first time, started attending classes even though he is a coach in a gym and works in the evenings (heavyweight). But he always asks what we studied in our classes. Ivan works with him personally and at times our families get together. His wife represents the local government and is strongly opposed to the Word of God. We pray for this family because difference in religious affiliations causes family problems.

I had to spend some time in the hospital at the Cardiology Department. People there responded to the Word of God and we distributed Bibles to those who wanted them.

Olga, my doctor, is very serious about studying God's Word. She welcomed our studies with patients and we distributed literature with her consent. Olga stays behind her working hours and we often had lengthy conversations. She would ask many questions related to the Word of God. She once said, "I have observed through my long-term experience that patients rejecting God's Word recover badly and those believing in God and reading His Word recover faster and respond to treatments much better." Please, pray for Olga. She would like to come to Bible classes but she works late hours and lives in a suburb, not in the city itself.

We continue helping the displaced—those who have made up their minds to settle down in Ivano-Frankivsk.

Thank you for humanitarian aid shipments. We are especially thankful to John, Jerry, Mike and all who work in warehouse for sacrifice of time and health as this shows Christian love and concern. They greatly help both the local and the displaced from other parts of Ukraine. Prices on utilities and food have increased by several times and it is now an even greater challenge for people to survive. Your shipments are even more urgent now, especially winter clothes, shoes, hygiene supplies and household detergents.

People from all over Ukraine ask us for help. All of our members are willing to work and help. And even though it is hard to survive nowadays the church members here give for construction of the church building. We are happy to say construction is in its active phase. We are thankful for all of the teachers who make sacrifices of their personal time and comfort of home and come to teach at the institute. They do a great job, because together we train future preachers for God's Kingdom. Students are getting a lot of homework. Their schedule is intense. I hope that the knowledge they receive here they will use at the local congregations of their future ministry.

Right now we have an evangelizing week at the institute. This time we divided the students into two groups. One of them participates in a campaign in Bila Tserkva. Alexey Mitskutis is guiding their efforts. He is BVBIU graduate of 2014, and I have recently invited him to be my assistant at the institute. Alexey will also be responsible for recruitment at the institute. The other group of students went to Dnepropetrovsk. They will help to start a new congregation there.

During the evangelizing campaign, we have a goal to invite people to come to Bible classes. During the week of campaign we have Bible classes every evening and try to provide the most important information, telling people about Christ and His plan of salvation. We do not have any new visitors yet. We continue praying for the souls of those who are not yet saved.

Last Sunday we continued the process of recruiting new students for the next semester. Alexey, Bogdan and I visited the Vinogradar church of Christ in Kyiv. It is a nice cozy church. I preached there, and we also did a short presentation about the institute. I hope that our search for the new students will be successful, and we will find people willing to study Holy Scriptures. Please pray for that.

We finally reached the long awaited moment when we can send a team of evangelists to the western part of Ukraine, to the city of Lviv. Three of BVBIU graduates Bogdan Chigvintsev, Stanislav Kuropiatnikov and Dmitriy Kuropiatnikov decided to plant a new church at the biggest city of western Ukraine. They are very determined. Their wives will support them. Thus the church there would already have 6 members. And if they evangelize persistently, then the church would have a growth prospects. Please pray for this young team that is willing to sacrifice their comfort to spread the kingdom of God.

This week we have our Masters program starting their last course for the students. This year we have three students graduating from this program: Stanislav Kuropiatnikov, Ivan Skoleba and Vadym Tymchenko. Unfortunately, they had to study longer than it was planned. As a result of military actions, we had to cancel classes for Masters program last year.

On Wednesdays we have Bible classes; on Thursdays there are classes of learning English through the Bible; on Fridays there are youth group meetings and classes for ladies; on Saturdays there is Bible school for kids, and of course there is Sunday worship.
