GARY WRITES... "BECOMING A GREAT PHYSICIAN, THE CHRIST FACTOR"

Since 1995 I have been blessed with the opportunity to be involved in the Lord's work in Ukraine; medical teams, humanitarian aid, camps and scholarship programs. BUT let me share with you the most exciting project yet! Last year I was approached by a group of African medical students displaced from their medical school in Donetsk when Russia invaded. These aspiring young physicians transferred to the medical school in Ivano-Frankivsk and established an organization whose purpose is to help train and mentor medical students as they plan to return to their respective homeland. Their 15 member planning committee, representing 7 African countries, approached me to help organize a medical team to lead their "MAKING A GREAT PHYSICIAN—THE CHRIST FACTOR" seminar in March 2018. They desire a hands-on conference with didactics and breakout sessions in physical diagnosis, suturing, OR protocols(gowning,

gloving, sterile technique), CPR, EKG, ultrasound and communication skills. I need a 10-12 person medical team to lead this project. I asked for and received from the planning committee a "think big" wish list of supplies. But what I need most are people—healthcare professionals (doctors, nurses, OR techs, etc) willing to be a part of this opportunity. This amazing group is planning for a 100+ person conference! What impresses me most is their willingness to share the Word of God with their fellow classmates and their singular mission is to return to their homeland and provide not only much needed healthcare but most importantly spiritual guidance.

This will be a 10 day trip in mid-March 2018 and will be in the western city of Ivano-Frankivsk, Ukraine. This is 1,000 kilometers from areas of unrest. I leave next month for my 40th trip to Ukraine and Lord willing will finalize the dates and venue for this conference. This mission trip may or may not interest you personally but you may know of someone searching for such an opportunity. <u>OR</u> you may be willing to help State side with supplies and equipment. ANDREW LAGNO GIVES INSIGHT TO THE LORD PLANTING A NEW CONGREGATION!

Greetings, dear brothers and sisters.

We thank God for this good opportunity to work for Him in Yaremche. Through relief shipments that we receive from John Kachelman we have gained credibility with the administration of the city, hospitals and an outpatient clinic in the nearby Mykulychyn.

During our first trip Marina and I visited hospital in Yaremche and met with Alexander Petrovich, the Chief Doctor of the hospital, who in his turn gave big thanks for the aid that we had provided for them for the past five years. He was especially thankful for the C-arm that they use in surgeries. He introduced us to a medical nurse from the out-patient clinic in Mykulychyn, Yaremche District, by the name of Galyna Ivanivna. The latter turned out to be a kind and good-hearted woman. She, in her turn, introduced us to the medical staff of the hospital and her daughter-in-law Marina, who is also a medical nurse. They jumped in to assist our efforts right away. She knows the local population very well since she has 5,000 people under her medical care.

Brother Ivan went with us on our second trip there. We visited District Hospital then, met with the Chief Doctor and discussed possibilities for our partnership and he agreed to give us a helping hand. Then we visited the area under Galyna Ivanivna's care, met with some families facing hardships in life and gave them rice mixes. Local people are very religious and treat strangers with caution because of different cults that exist in that area. When we found out that the local clinic was out of blood pressure devices we mentioned it in our Sunday worship. It touched many hearts at Church and we collected enough money to buy four blood pressure devices and two nebulizers. Samuel, one of our brethren and a Medical student, gave \$50.00 and Patrice gave up her blood pressure cuff. People were bewildered and grateful to get those blood pressure cuffs on behalf of the Church. Summer Teaching Events in Stary Lysets

Greetings, brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus. I am sending you greetings on behalf of Christians that live in Western Ukraine, in the Region of Ivano-Frankivsk. We rejoice as we thank God for your prayers and fellowship that we enjoy in Christ.

One more month of our lives has passed and I would like to share some news with you and let you know of the things that happened in our lives – some joyful things and things that we were preoccupied with for you to see God's hand in everything we do.

I would like to begin with news and events in Stary Lysets. At the beginning of the month there was a children's Christian camp held there. Our brethren from America headed by Mike Lawson as well as Julia and myself set it all up. Camp was held at secondary school. It was a great blessing to teach lessons on character values with Bible and Biblical stories as our guidance.

God blessed us and everything was filled with Christian love and upbuilding. Even a Greek Catholic priest that came to see what we were teaching "his" children had to admit that classes were in line with the Scripture and knowledge of God. He saw us teach the Scripture in its purity and could not find any fault with us. It was awesome as we saw God's hand and protection that encouraged us greatly. "If God is with us who can be against us?" We are thankful to all brethren that took part in the preparatory work for the camp as well as those who donated funds so that God is glorified in this work and His Kingdom grows.

Julia and I are trying now to figure out how we should follow up on the work that has already been done there to keep in contact with the school and children. We think and plan to open an English Language School to study the language through the Scripture where besides English we would like to teach classes on character training through the Scripture as well. She comes from Eastern Ukraine where she grew up and found Church and Christ. We met when I was enrolled in Bible School in Gorlivka (Donetsk Region). Julia has moved to Ivano-Frankivsk and helps me with everything I do for God. She taught Bible class to older children last Sunday. Both Church and children in particular enjoyed it so we plan to continue. Poles to a clinic in the village of Manyava. Volodymyr Ivanovych, the mayor, was very thankful for the aid. He showed us around the clinic and spoke about some needs. We met a young dentist by the name of Vitaly. He showed us his office and his dental unit made in 1964. Health care is in great need in that village. There are 5,000 people that the hospital cares for and all doctors have to walk to see their patients as there is not transportation for them, not even bikes. They do have an old Lada but it is out of whack and there are no parts to fix it.

Now we focus on distant mountain areas as we distribute humanitarian aid because people that live there are in greater need both material and spiritual. We give out Bibles with our phone number and address. Our WBI students apply their knowledge preaching with word and deed in those areas.

There were forty-eight present in our assembly last Sunday. We had guests from EEM – eight Americans and their interpreters. They work at children's camp in Western Ukraine teaching Christian character. They came to worship with us and together we had our first assembly in the new building.

Our WBI students have passed their exams and have become sophomores. We pray for our second year. And now we also need to find resources to provide scholarships for Inna and Volodymyr.

Valentina received her bucket from America (sent by the Meridianville church of Christ) and was very happy. She thanked God for it. She says she is so happy to have spiritual brethren all over the world. She looked through the things in the bucket with such a delight! She loved the cat and candy. She promised to write to the family that sent her the bucket.
