I WENT TO BIDAN NAGAR WE HAD ONE DAY BIBLE CLASS...MANY MEMBERS OF THE CONGREGATION AND NON-CHRISTIANS ATTENDED...SEVEN PEOPLE OBEYED THE GOSPEL. WE WALKED THREE MILES FOR SUFFICIENT WATER FOR BAPTISMS."

The month of August has passed us and as I look back to glean reporting details it all seems like a blur. The month was more than "busy." From the Judsonia warehouse we loaded two containers for Ukraine in August one for Kyiv and one for Ivano-Frankivsk. These were containers #18 & #19 for this year. These two containers moved *60,175 pounds of HOSPITAL BEDS and supplies!!!* 

The Fall mission trip to Ukraine is to begin 14 September. This trip will take me to locations surrounding these cities: Kyiv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kherson, Zaporozhye, Kramatorsk, Vinnytsia, Khmelnytsk and other locations. I am scheduled to return to the USA on 14 October.

Upon returning I will hold a gospel meeting with the Wayne Furnace church of Christ (Waynesboro, TN) and then begin making visits to give updates on the mission efforts to supporters. The last quarter on the year looks very busy at this point! Please contact me for speaking dates.

A number have visited our brethren in Ivano-Frankivsk during the summer months and it has been encouraging to hear them report on their visits and the promises of amazing opportunities.

How are you sir? How is sister Gennie? And how is brother Ernie? We are praying for you all. Kindly convey my thanks and the thanks of the poor widows for his help. Sir, I thank you for helping the widows this month. I know your loving kind heart.

#### DISTRIBUTION OF BENEVOLENT ITEMS

We continue giving humanitarian aid. The greater part of these last two shipments has been distributed to villages. People are excited about buckets, matches and candles more than anything else. The majority of those that live in villages have furnaces to heat their houses using logs and in winter power goes off from time to time, thus, they use candles a lot. Big thanks for washing detergents and lice treatment. Big thanks for bed linens that you sent us and that we used to help our displaced people (they got blankets, sheets and pillows). We visited a local hospital, made contacts with doctors through benevolent help given to the hospital (we had helped them before and knew the Chief Doctor). Thus, we plan to begin working in Lysets, establishing contacts, getting to know people, preaching the Gospel.

Sir, whenever, we think of you our hearts are becoming heavy with gratitude. I want to see you. please send a latest picture of you and sister Gennie please. So that we can see you, if not personally.

India is a sub-continent. We are almost equal to China in population. Many religions and many regions. Our states are formed on the basis of languages, because we have many languages. But Hindi is our official language. People of many states use Hindi language. Most of the people in India are Hindus.

Gospel is needed very much in India. Christianity is less in India, specially in Northern India. Please pray for the people of our country.

On 24th of last month, I started from my place to Bidan Nagar which is in West Bengal State. I traveled around 1,500 miles. I went to Bidan Nagar where brother Ranthu Mahali preaches. We had one day Bible class on 27th. I visited surrounding places also and preached. I stayed almost one week. In my absence, my son Sam is taking care of the work in Jadcherla.

In the one day Bible class in Bidan Nagar many members of the congregation and non-Christians attended. We had class from 10 AM to 1 PM and 2 PM TO 4 PM. I and brother Massi Tudu of Bihar and Steven of our state also preached. Some people responded to the word of God. Seven people obeyed the Gospel. We walked three miles for sufficient water for baptisms. I send few pictures of Bible class and baptisms soon. Kindly pray for the spiritual growth of new souls.

Some preachers of Nepal country, which is a bordering country to us, contacted me through some preachers of Bihar State. They invited me to visit and preach there. Nepal is not a secular country. It is Hindu country. So Gospel is needed very much. I am thinking to visit Nepal in the month in the second week of September. Please pray for my trip.

We are sincerely praying for you all. I once again thank you all for your sacrificial and mighty helps. Closing with love, yours Immadi

#### A SHIPMENT INTO NIGERIA...

Greetings! Thank you for your hard work in the Lord's Vineyard. I took me a whole week in Abuja to process the papers for the shipment with the Federal Inland Revenue Service (FIRS), Ministry of Budget & National Planning (MBNP), Federal Ministry of Finance (FMF) and National Environmental Standards Regulatory Enforcement Agency (NESREA) It was be God's grace that we were able to complete such a rigorous paperwork. We hope to receive the Letter of Permission before September 8.

Please there's something I forgot to mention. We need a large supply of winter clothes for children and a few for adult. There's a season here known as harmattan period, a very cold period similar to winter as you have it there. In some years, it begins as early as November and would not go till March or April.

Please do you have eye glasses and lenses in the warehouse that you could send with the shipment? Many brethren here are having eye problems which requires the use of sunshade and lenses. Thanks for everything!



We are looking for lodging now and making plans for our work there. Thus, I would like to ask all of you who care for Church in Ukraine to pray for this ministry for God to build His Kingdom through us and through our joint efforts. Special thanks go to brothers Jim and Ray for their desire to serve God and Church in Ukraine. It is so encouraging to see the Lord do His work through such brothers.

Brother Olexy (Alex), whom this world tried to pull back in upon his baptism, has been back to the assembly regularly. He and his wife (Julia) did not get on too well for a while. Julia's parents contributed to many of their issues as they lived with them. That is why Olexy rented a part of an old house for the family to live separately and independently from Julia's parents. Last week men of the congregation helped them move and they are settling in their new place. # IVAN SKOLEBA REPORTS FROM IVANO-FRANKIVSK, UKRAINE...

Greetings, dear brothers and sisters!

We had a very hot summer, which was unusual for this area. Our climate is changing for some reason. Here in Western Ukraine we are in for a rainy season after horribly hot summer. Rain causes damage to many people flooding storage facilities where they store food and machinery, tossing away hay from their fields, flooding their cars and some were filled up with water. We haven't had anything like that since the flood in 2008. Climate has been changing. It may well be that nuclear explosions in the North Korea and China triggered the change. Even our seismologists were able to register the wobbling of the earth. Some are anxious about future but the majority live for the day, drinking booze, having the ball and attending church on holidays to confess their sins to the priests and then sliding back to their heathen life. People have a big problem in their lives - they don't read the Bible because they don't believe it is given by God. Scientists try hard to prove there's no God, they shoot documentaries where they present a hypothesis as a real fact luring young people to believe the lie. All Orthodox churches are busy playing politics, fighting for money and power, building humongous cathedrals and causing souls to die because they (Orthodox churches) neither preach the Gospel themselves not let people learn the truth preventing them from studying the truth and washing their brains with holidays and traditions that have nothing to do with God and salvation.

But we have the hope promised to us by the Lord in John 14:2-4 and Revelation 21:1-4. These words give hope and purpose to the work we do together with you.

The majority of those that live in villages have furnaces to heat their houses using logs and in winter power goes off from time to time, thus, they use candles a lot. Big thanks for washing detergents and lice treatment. Big thanks for bed linens that you sent us and that we used to help our displaced people (they got blankets, sheets and pillows). As for dishes, we gave them to people, members and displaced people from Donetsk and Lugansk Regions. Rice that Kathy sent has helped us out a lot. We give a box of rice per family monthly and they share rice with their kin.

We continue studies at WBI and are in 1st and 2nd Samuel right now.

Andrew and Marina visit Yaremche preaching and getting to know people there. They have already made contacts with a few families that they visit every time they go there. We pray for their ministry and ask God to open up people's hearts there. We have found out from Andrew that there is young family that wants to sell some of their children because they cannot provide food for all 5 of them. When people found out about it they would watch them to make sure they don't do it. The husband is trying to drown his grief drinking booze and the wife is at a loss as to what she should do. Young families suffer more than others for they have no jobs, no money, and no future. Such need not just help but psychological programs to relieve their stress.

Volodya and Julia work in Lysets. They are getting ready for their wedding. We try to encourage them as much as we can. We pray to God and ask Him to help these young families to become good workers for the Lord.

This summer, Pasha brought his children, Daniel and Ivan, to Ivano-Frankivsk. They are in school now and attend all children's Bible classes. Pasha tries to do as much church work as possible and he is also in charge of the Correspondence Bible School. He prays to God asking for the Lord to help him bring his wife back. It is for the first time in three years that she's here. Please, pray for our families for the Lord to help them recover what satan destroyed.

Anya has been admitted to the Medical School. We thank God for that and pray to the Lord asking Him to help her complete all studies and find her niche in the medical field for her to help people and be a good Christian example to the students and teachers.

Thank you for your prayers and support for without them we would never have what we have now. Glory to our God in the name of Christ for everything.
