FINALLY! I have the September-October UKRAINE MISSION Newsletter ready to send. The two months covered in this newsletter were crammed with appointments, travel, and actions that individually would consume a large chunk of time. When the events and actions are combined, I sit in amazement that such was accomplished. I have tried to send out brief updates via the web site blog page and we will soon make the combined Dalraida mission trip report available online and I will mail to those who receive snail-mail reports.

During the last two-years I have wrestled with the Ukraine Ministry of Social Policy on approvals for containers shipped to the needy. This developed into a much more intense situation as I met with the "Task Group" in Kyiv last month. It seems that this "Task Group" is intent on arrogating authority that is not given to them and refuses to follow the Rule of Law. I have exhausted all possible help in Ukraine and will soon ask you to contact your Congressional Delegate. I am working on compiling a succinct summary of the criminal actions and you can include that along with a personal letter, email AND fax to your Senators and Representative. Kathy Cadden has already contacted those representing Mississippi but the elections have hindered any response. Now that elections are finished, we are about to begin contact with Washington, DC.

This newsletter contains the reports from September and October. So much happened that it is very difficult to decide what is to be reported and what is to be culled. (Some of the reports will have news of events that have transpired because of this newsletter being tardy). You will read of immersions in India and Ukraine that are encouraging as commitment to follow the Lord's commands are visibly expressed in a self-surrender of will and being newly born as God's child.

I have also been busily engaged in looking for a suitable warehouse in the Montgomery, AL area. The other locations where loadings occur (Columbus, MS; Judsonia, AR; Neelyville, MO) have been busily receiving commodities for shipments and are struggling with full warehouses. We are trying to move those commodities to other nations as all shipments into Ukraine are stopped until the "Task Group" issue is eliminated.

Budgets for 2019 are currently being set. *I ask that you and your congregation seriously consider UKRAINE MISSIONS in your budget.* As usual our support is fluid and economic issues and health of supporters require discovering additional support. THANK YOU to those supporting our efforts!

These are Victor and Valentina from Central Ukraine - Poltava Region. Valentina is an English Language teacher and Victor has his own business. They study and worship on Wednesday and Sunday through internet.

Inna is a retired Police General. She attended several retreats held by the Hillsboro Church and Mike Lawson's team. Inna decided to be immersed but asked us not to take photos. Ludmila is a manager at a plant. Her two children live in Russia. As for Luda, she lives by herself. She has attended Church and studied the Bible for half a year before she was immersed. Bill and Luba studied with Inna and Luda. There used to be another friend of Inna's, Tamara, who was a Police Colonel but she passed away a few weeks ago. She had been thinking about being baptized as well but did not make it. Her death shook and horrified both Inna and Luda and they decided to become Christians.

These people grew up under Communism and are afraid of publicity and pictures. In the past, they could have lost their ranks and jobs for doing for they did.

IVAN SKOLEBA REPORTS FROM IVANO-FRANKIVSK, UKRAINE...

September 2018. Ivano-Frankivsk

Greetings, dear brothers and sisters! Thank you for your prayers and support of our ministry in Ukraine. It is through our joint efforts that the Gospel is being preached in Western Ukraine.

Here is a common situation we find every day. Some consider themselves Christians from their childhood, living in a Christian country, and say Church reads the Bible, now say they have read it for the first time! But they say they do know that there is Christ who somewhere at certain time died for people. And many are surprised to hear that the Bible's message is personal and should concern each one of us. They say that they have never heard such a thing before. These are very good people but their understanding and knowledge of God is almost absent.

We find that the people in Western Ukraine are ignorant of the Holy Scripture. This is true even though Western Ukraine is more religious that Eastern Ukraine. It is all because the Orthodox Church considers the Holy Scripture as important as tradition that has developed in the course of 2,000 years. So people are confused with inspired truth and human thoughts and feelings. It is sad that often they believe and practiced more tradition than they do inspired teaching. Many know nothing of Bible content and so Bible stories are viewed as myths.

We are looking forward to having the Dalraida Church of Christ team here to join with us in a campaign in three towns of the Ivano-Frankivsk Region – Ugornyky, Lysets and Sniatyn/Yaremche. People in those places are open to the church of Christ as they have received humanitarian aid from us for many years.

The challenge we face at this point is that some of the topics are Bible stories that no one here has ever read. Some think these are not real facts but some imagined myth used to encourage a cult.

The campaign will last five days – October 8 - 12. Dear brethren, please, pray for us, for the Lord to open doors for those that seek Him. Please, pray for wisdom and power to secure those souls and to help them mature in the spirit. We desperately need your prayers and your help.

We continue assembling on Wednesdays and Sundays at our rented meeting place. Our Sunday service is from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. We teach our Wednesday Bible class from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. Friday is a day when we have a joint prayer for the Church and evangelism.

Besides, we help individuals and different groups by giving away humanitarian aid and working with them as we are allowed. We have received a container with medical scrubs and shoes. Upon Customs clearance, we will distribute this relief shipment. Doctors need scrubs and coats as many have to wear old and worn out lab coats. There is still war going in this country so the medical provision is very poor and inadequate.

Construction of our church building is going on. And today with your help, we started pouring intermediate floor between the first and the second floors.

October 2018. Ivano-Frankivsk

Greetings, dear brothers and sisters!

The month of October was very special to the brethren here. We were so happy to have guests from America and we thank God for the time of fellowship that we had together with you and for your good Christian example to us.

Thank you for your visit, for being so organized, and for your desire to share the Gospel with people around you. Each one of you had a great impact on us and on people of Ukraine. You refreshed our spirits and we felt a part of one spiritual family.

We receive phone calls from all places of Christian outreach where you went – Yaremche, Snaityn, Ugornyky and Starry Lysets. People from different walks of life – teachers, deputies, students, average people, whose children go to school or kindergarten – all of them want to thank you for help and quality fellowship. School in Snaityn gives their big thanks for the laptop. They need it for the math classes. They had already bought the projector but had run out of money to buy a computer. Neither teachers nor parents had no means for purchasing laptop and were discouraged. Their children could not use it for half a year. School budgets are usually minimal and cover only urgent needs. Your gift of the laptop caused great joy to the whole school, both students and teachers. So now they can use the laptop as well as the projector.

One very kind act on the part of those visiting is still being talked about in Snaityn. That was the \$200.00 that you gave to save a life. With the money doctors were able to cure Roman. His family could not afford those expensive medicines and doctors were thinking about discharging him from the hospital to die at home. And when his wife brought the \$200.00 he could stay at hospital for three more days and in that period he received more medicines. These extra medicines helped him and he recovered. Roman is sending his special heartfelt thanks to the American brethren that helped him survive.

The Lord was gracious to us when we worked in Ugornyky. We were very concerned about our success in that village thinking we would not be accepted there. The village is very religious and the priest himself had talked to Lubov (the mayor) about the danger of "other" teachings. But with Lord's help and all humanitarian aid that we had given them for many years we were able to show we are not bringing trouble. We were allowed to teach children conversational English at school and kindergarten and all involved had delightful experiences. The wonderful bond of friendship and cooperation became strong. In the evening, the local mayor Lubov opened her auditorium and office for us to teach classes to children and adults. Children and adults that came to evening classes sat in chairs shipped by our American brethren through John Kachelman.

Since the large group left, we have had a couple of baptisms. It was a couple from Central Ukraine. They will worship with us online as they live 650 kilometers away from us. Bill and Luba had taught the Bible to them.

Many people in Ukraine observed both the younger and older Americans who were so friendly and open that they were amazed in their hearts to see such love in you.

Your love to God and your affection toward us served as a great example and uplifted our brethren and us.

I take an active part in the life of the Church, in fellowship, in distribution of humanitarian aid to different medical institutions, orphanages, schools. We also distribute clothes and food to people in Ivano-Frankivsk and villages in the Region. Many people are so thankful to you and to God, who works through us on this earth.

I continue teaching correspondence Bible classes to my beloved students. I fervently pray to the Lord to bless me for this ministry and to give me wisdom to explain the truth without twisting it. Greetings to you, dear brothers and sisters. We want to share some joyful news with you. A lot of different events have taken place since our last communication that have encouraged us in our ministry. We have been to the orphanage in Mykulychyn several times and have delivered clothes and other things that sisters sent for children. We had good fellowship with the kids and they sang us some songs on one of the trips.

Besides, we continue working with the staff of the outpatient clinic in Mykulychyn that provides medical assistance to the population there and have practical knowledge of those families that are in dire straits. We visited those families and treated children with some peanut butter. Children were beyond themselves with joy and surprises when they received our gifts. One boy took his peanut butter sandwich and devoured it having hidden himself. To account for such behavior, nurses told us that his parents are drunks and have six children, and children often would go hungry. We took food supplies and gave them out. All people were thankful.

We stay in contact with the local hospital in Yaremche that provides medical assistance to the people in the town and its outskirts. They have received tangible aid from us, such as medical equipment, furniture, and consumables. Through this work Church gains more credibility with the local people.

We cannot help sharing with you news of a very important event. We are talking about the visit from our Dalraida brethren. It was an unforgettable visit for everybody involved. For the first time, people could see and hear those brethren we had told them about. We gave out Bibles and people rejoiced as they took them promising to read and ask questions.

We visited the school in Mykulychyn, too. Will and Caleb had a good visit with children and played soccer with them. Ainsley joined them the next day when together they taught Bible classes and gave out children's Bibles to the children and adult's Bibles to the teachers there. Teachers were so thankful that they asked us to leave the Americans with them for at least one year. The visit was unforgettable to all those that we had time to visit within a short period of time. Until now, do we receive joyful comments, thanks and invitations to come back. We hope things will work out for us to meet again and join our efforts to the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ.
