Then the men tackled the monstrous "GIANT HOGWEED" that was all around the construction. The stalks of this weed grow 12-14 feet high and its sap can blister skin and blind eyes!

During these past weeks two special men passed from this life. Dave Walden was a good friend and a constant supporter of our mission efforts. Talking with Dave was always an encouraging time. Larry LaBrot was a good friend and I performed his marriage ceremony. Both Dave and Larry lived in the St. Louis area and were "just kids" when I went to Southside in my first located work.

CONSTRUCTION NEEDS TO BE RESUMED!

A plea from your brethren in Ivano-Frankivsk...

Dear brothers and sisters!

The Church of Christ in Ivano-Frankivsk is greeting you. We thank God for all of you, for your prayers and especially for your donations toward the construction of our church building. It is a great blessing to have such brethren that are far away who have a desire to help us both spiritually and financially.

We live in an area where traditional religious beliefs, such as Catholic and Orthodox, are deeply rooted and prevail in minds and hearts of people. It was a challenge to invite or explain to people why we assembled in an apartment for a long time. We have grown in number since then and with the support from our American brethren we have been able to assemble at a rented office facility for a certain period of time. A Church without a worship place is looked down at by locals as a "nomad cult" and not worthy of paying attention to as her future is uncertain. All religious groups in Ukraine have their church

buildings, where they successfully carry out their mission. People are used to thinking that a church is a building first of all. Many people that we know do not come to Church because we do not have our own assembly place. With the help from God and John Kachelman's hard work, Churches in the USA have heard about us, our great desire and need to have our own meeting place.

Many of you know, and some have been to Ukraine and have seen, what was done by the help from God and your financial support. As of now, we have the first level, and intermediate floor between the first and second levels finished. We desperately need to roof it over this year. This has to be done to keep the brick work and all other work that has been done from being wasted as well as the money that has been invested thus far.

As of today, John already has a certain amount but it still is not enough for the builders to get down to work. We will be able to join in the work when the building has the roof, windows and heating run into it. The church members will do inside work then such as plastering, flooring, etc.

Thus, at this point, we are in dire need of your financial support. Together, we have done a lot already. Besides, we are going to use this same building as a facility for the first Ukrainian speaking Bible Institute in Ukraine. We already have it set up in this city and have had the first graduation this year.

The church building is between two cities that are growing very fast. Besides, the village that donated the plot of land to us is growing as well as all surrounding villages. Our church building is being constructed so it will be in the heart of the junction of many communities in the near future.

Brethren! We are so thankful to God for you and your support of Ukraine and Ukrainians. We work in God's vineyard for the same Cause and will get a reward from God when we stand before His throne.

May God be with all of you and outpour His blessings on you sustaining you through your lives. We keep all of you in our hearts and prayers.

All men are active in worship and Wednesday Bible classes. We take turns preaching on Sundays and teaching on Wednesdays. Every man seeks to talk about unity, support/encouragement, and studying of the Word of God. Those attending evening classes are very much involved in discussion.

May 31 – June 2, the congregation went to the retreat in Yaremche by Mike Lawson and his team. It was there that the first WBI graduation took place. David Hamrick, Director of the School, and Brendon Ferguson, coordinator for Ukraine Extension, were present at the graduation. American brothers who have been coming to Ukraine, can see that the students, WBI graduates now, have matured in spirit. This results from God's work and your prayers for us.

It rained over a month here and now dry and hot weather has set in. Together we struggled to keep under control a very poisonous plant called "Giant Hogweed" that thrived on our property (http://www.bio.brandeis.edu/fieldbio/Verrill_Wolf/pages/Giant_Hogweed.html). We had to borrow biohazard coveralls from the Emergency Control Department (we know people there through humanitarian aid) to cut the plants. This plant is hard to exterminate and its juice burns skin and blinds the eyes.

We pray that soon we will have enough money to resume construction of the church building. We try to encourage one another and do everything together as much as possible. Some of our sisters gave of their time on two Wednesdays to put our office (that is also children's classroom) in order. One sister mended all Bibles and songbooks. These fruits result from God working within each of us.

Our African brethren have passed exams successfully and Emmanuel left for home to be with his family. Nana and Samuel are in Ukraine. Nana still leads singing. He delights in this ministry.

Season of vacations has started in summer and some members have gone on trips and some have already come back. As you remember, we have displaced people at Church. This time of the year they go back to check on their homes. Please, pray for them and their travels.

Our Sunday worship service begins at 11:00 a.m. and is over at 1:00 p.m. June's attendance has varied from 20 to 57 adults with 5 to 9 children. Children's Classes are taught by Julia, Marina and Masha. The Wednesday Bible class attendance is 10-15.

Thank you so much for praying for us; for giving us spiritual and financial support. We work for the same Cause – to shine God's light into this world.


Please, pray for my wife Masha. She is in her last month of pregnancy. Thank you for the prayers you have already prayed on our behalf.

HOWELL FERGUSON FROM TANZANIA...

This June will be remembered as another very busy month at the Chimala Mission. Already this year, we have had a number of visitors mostly those who have asked to take a medical elective at the Chimala Mission Hospital. These include nursing students from Harding and OCU as well as medical students from Hong Kong, Germany, England and South Africa. In the middle of this were the final clearing and delivery of two 40' shipping containers: one that had 179 school desks; and the other comprising of a large rotary tiller for the farm program, drip irrigation kits, medical equipment, cabinets and supplies, as well as office furniture. And there are miscellaneous items too numerous to mention that are needed at the Chimala Mission. The desks are a great addition to the mission schools as most of the existing desks are handmade and mostly in a poor state of repair.
