September 2019

"IVANO-FRANKIVSK, LYSETS AND UGORNYKY ARE EXCITED ABOUT YOUR VISIT!"

The month of September was full of actions and it concluded with my departure for Ukraine on 30 September! During September we sorted about 20 pallets of miscellaneous medical supplies, unloaded four truckloads of donated medical items, loaded two containers for Nigeria (one in Montgomery, AL and one in Judsonia, AR) and we loaded two containers for Ukraine in Booneville, MS. I have sent brief reports on the fantastic loads. THANK YOU to all who joined to make these incredible results possible.

The current mission trip to Ukraine involves at least three phases. The first group has been involved in teaching and visiting various sites. These brethren came from TN and OH. The second group involves a team of ten from the Dalraida Church of Christ in Montgomery, AL. The third team will be composed of Gif and Simba as they remain after the larger group leaves and will be completing the remaining objectives. The overall objective for these teams has been to help the Ivano-Frankivsk congregation understand and implement elementary concepts of congregational autonomy. The practical goal is an independent, active New Testament congregation involved in the community as a light of God's Word.

The first group has completed its time in Ivano-Frankivsk and are currently in Kyiv and soon on their way back to the USA.

In this month's newsletter are three reports from brethren in Ivano-Frankivsk. Thank you for your support, prayers and encouragement in the Lord's work, not only in Ukraine but in TWENTY-FIVE other nations!

Everybody looks forward to seeing John and the team from Dalraida in October. Besides us, Lysets and Ugornyky are excited about your visit as they have known many of you for several years. Many teenagers have become







university students this year and have left Ivano-Frankivsk and some have gone abroad for studies. They are sorry that they will not be able to see you.

I had meetings with people in different places where we evangelized and where you had visited. I talked to them about "Who God Is" in reality and about His Church. Some have different problems in their lives. God appears to use those problems to make them ready to talk on topics like these. As you know, Satan is wide awake and soon their problems come back. Please, pray for them. I cannot give you any more details as I have promised them that what they shared would remain between us and would not go public.

Besides, we continue construction of our church building that you and God help us with. Everything has gone according to the schedule thus far.

Recently, together with other men we have once again cut the poisonous plants around the church building. It is the same poisonous plant that I mentioned to you before (Giant Hogweed).

Unfortunately, our sister in Christ and Andrew's sibling, Nataly, passed away. Many of you also know Vasyl Vitovsky, dentist, whom Ron has helped a lot. He had a son who was also a dentist. Vasyl has a drinking problem and now has a terminal cancer. His son was on drugs. We tried to help him get off drugs but he succumbed and passed away not long ago. Satan won one soul. Please, pray for God's mercy so that Vasyl could repent before he leaves this world. We talk to him about God all the time.

As usual, we have our Sunday worship from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Attendance is steady in numbers. We teach Wednesday Bible class from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. There are usually 12-17 in attendance. Besides, we have a prayer session on Friday.

My younger son turned eight weeks yesterday but he looks like he is 24. The elder son goes to school and likes it so far.

My family is sending you their warmest greetings. We look forward to your visit.
